Mr David Lewis MB ChB, MD, EBSQ (vasc), FRCS

Mr Lewis is a graduate of the University of Bristol, School of Medicine. After completing a lectureship in anatomy at the university he continued his surgical training at Bristol and Manchester before becoming a Fellow of the Royal College of Surgeons in 1996. He then undertook two years of dedicated research into the treatment of patients with vascular disease and was awarded the higher post-graduate degree of Doctor of Medicine (MD) for his thesis on this

subject.

Further surgical training at the Royal North Shore Hospital in Sydney, Australia and the University of Massachusetts in the USA saw him made an Honorary Associate of the University of Sydney in 2002 in recognition of his contribution to vascular surgical research. He passed the Intercollegiate Surgical Fellowship exam in 2003 and was certified by the European Board of Surgery as a Specialist Vascular Surgeon in 2005. he has a wealth of international experience treating patients with peripheral vascular disease, aneurysms, carotid artery disease, varicose veins and hyperhidrosis.
